Interview with Jaleh Etemad, SLMM President by Mary Carroll Nelson

In an hour of conversation based on a set of questions, Jaleh Etemad spoke openly of her fascinating life. Born in Azerbaijan, Iran as the eldest of three children in a modern family, she was exposed to music (violin) and French in early childhood. At 17, her parents sent her to England to be educated, first, in an all girls' school to study language. She earned her bachelor's degree at the Royal Institute of Medical Technology and her master's at the Northhampton College of Advanced Technology, specializing in Electron Microscopy, both in London. She worked in Cancer Research for eight years, in London and Teheran. Galen Etemad, an engineer working in the aerospace industry in California, was lecturing in Tehran during the Apollo Moon Landing when Jaleh met him. Their long marriage began in Dec 29, 1969 in Tehran and she moved to Los Angeles with her husband January of 1970. They have two children, Nakissa and Cyrus.

Jaleh devoted herself to her family, but she suffered from loneliness and dislocation in those first years. Her thoughts turned to art and the fine paintings by her mother on the walls of her girlhood home. Twice a week, Galen dropped Cyrus at nursery school so she could study portrait painting at Los Angeles Valley College. Her classmates took turns posing for each other and her fellow students wanted to buy her paintings of them, an encouragement to Jaleh, who became "committed to the academic, personal, and professional pursuit of art." She earned a B.A. in Fine Art from California State University at Northridge in 1986. To honor her as an outstanding alumna, two deans from CSUN visited her studio in 2011 to prepare a retrospective installation of her work in the newly built Performing Art Center Gallery.

"Art was my salvation. It satisfied my inner spiritual needs. I took many classes, even after graduation, because I like to paint with other artists," she says. Within her largely abstract and expressionistic paintings, there is often a figurative element. She bridges the interface between illusory and tangible. Her oeuvre includes watermedia on paper, mounted on canvas, as well as 3-D mobile constructions.

Galen retired and went into real estate in Northern California, where they have lived ever since, when Nikki was still in high school, Jaleh became acquainted with another student's mother, Juliet Wood, then the Regional Coordinator for SLMM. They exchanged slides of their work. Juliet immediately recognized Jaleh's



affinity with SLMM's premise; she soon invited her to attend local meetings. "I sat and listened. I thought, I belong with these people. It touched what I was feeling inside. Then, my close friend died of cancer."

While grieving for her loss, Jaleh did a series of large paintings in dark tones. It was these that she submitted with her application for full membership. "I had realized that healing is a part

of it...(what SLMM is about). Today, there is a notable change in Jaleh's palette. From the dark tones of that time, she is now using higher key, brighter, more celestial colors with a goodly amount of white, blue, yellow and orange. Jaleh has exhibited widely: in the Bay Area, Hawaii and New Mexico, Paris, Stockholm, Rome and Beijing. Our conversation moved on to Jaleh's relationship to SLMM. "SLMM has accepted me with open arms.

Knowing the group has been important to me. I really do connect. When you love something, you go for it. What comes out of it is always good."

After serving on the board as Vice President, Jaleh began her five-year term as president of SLMM in 2013, assuming the task at the National Conference in Atlanta. "Taking on this job," she says, "was scary." SLMM is not her only obligation. After three years as Heritage and Arts Commissioner in the Town of Tiburon, she was appointed Tiburon Peninsula Artist Laureate, a four-year commitment and a working challenge. Jaleh has curated exhibits and directs a continuing calendar of art related events for her area. However, she is an excellent multi-tasker and a good deal of her time is spent on behalf of SLMM.

Looking ahead, Jaleh has both practical and idealistic goals for SLMM that she would like to realize during the remaining four years of her term. She has concentrated on the website, working with Carleen Hearn to redesign and make it as accessible and simple to use as possible. Before the National Conference in Hays, Kansas, there will be a new brochure to serve as an Introduction to SLMM as well as an application for Associate Membership. Regional Coordinators can use them to encourage membership. They will be available at all SLMM events. The triple fold design will include text, information, illustrations and the form to use for joining.

"I'd like to see members use their computers more often. I hope they will go to the website frequently and read the newsletters. There is a lot of information on the website, with new material of importance to the members. My personal goal is to bring unity and dedication to our group. I respect the members who love SLMM and I will work for the betterment of our society. I cannot do it alone. But, I can direct the membership toward the continuance of SLMM for many years to come."
