
October 6 - November 11 — Regional Exhibitionat the Millicent Rogers Museum in Taos, NM The Museum is a historical site and is one of the best venues for holding an exhibit in Taos. The theme for the show is 'THE OMEGA AND THE ALPHA: in the end is the beginning'. Inspiration for the title is the phrase "the end times". A number of predictions agree that the winter solstice of 2012, December 21, marks the end of a cycle. The vision of the exhibit is not of fatal endings. Instead, it presents an interface between the present and the future. The theme is not a narrow, dark limitation, but a doorway to expanding our creative consciousness. There will be an opening reception with light refreshments on Saturday, October 6 from 2 – 4 pm. The Museum is open daily from 10 am to 5 pm.
