



After a great breakfast, Nina Mihm, President, welcomed everyone to the first Breakfast Buffet and General Meeting. Nina expressed her appreciation to everyone who helped coordinate the calendar of events for the conference and a special thanks to Rae Dollard, Ann Hartley and Delda Skinner for assembling all the lovely gift bags. Nina outlined the events for the day and conducted a "roll call" for the bus to the Blanton Museum.

Nina explained to the members that one of the goals of this year's conference was to gather a "sharing of ideas, suggestions, criticism and/or praise" from all members on how SLMM can be strengthened from within so that we may accomplish several goals as the organization grows, such as, attracting new members,

effectively demonstrate the underlying holistic premise of the SLMM society by organizing exhibitions, symposia, tours, meet the emotional and spiritual needs of its members "... by encouraging creative expression and dynamic growth" and fulfill SLMM's promise to serve as an educational society. Hands flew in the air and the room burst with energy. Here are the comments that were presented:

- Webpage Gallery is a great little stimulus, if you haven't visited it, please do so, it's great!
- Everyone, that hasn't already, should get an "artist page" for \$100.00 through Carleen & expand.
- We need more men as members!
- Ditto the Webpage & Gallery. I want to get to know (and collaborate with) more artists in my area.
- Get computer savvy. It helps to get closer to what's going on. More social networking. Have local regions do more "get togethers". Some regions have a monthly calendar.
- When regional director has something going on, they could forward to the other regions.
- More communication in general, maybe phone conferences.
- Regional meetings have a lot of activity. I'm grateful to be in Texas. I remember an experience I had at a Rothko exhibit. A lady that was standing next to me said "...you must get closer to painting to understand it better". I did just that and the dark void I had previously seen in the painting became alive with a myriad of colors. "I could literally feel the heartbeat of the painting."
- When I was registering yesterday, several people came up to inquire about SLMM. Some wanted to join right
 there. One lady who took the information said "her daughter would love this"! We should have brochures to
 pass out next time for interested people.
- Promote membership. Strengthen, not re-invent ourselves.
- Take pictures at all SLMM events. Write articles and submit to at least 2 local newspapers.
- Take pictures of the 2010 Conference and send to Carleen to be published on the webpage for members who couldn't attend.
- There is always something going on within a two mile radius of Houston. Would like a flyer or "handout" to
 pass around for publicity (tri-fold brochure would be great). We could take them to shows, make a poster and
 set it up on a stand maybe.
- Make individual business cards and reference the webpage. Promote slmm.org.
- Make a stamp for the membership card.
- Have it on a program and regional coordinators could run off/print.
- Thrilled with promo idea as handout but maybe something crispier ...brilliant idea!
- "Lone Star Art Guild" (1,000 members) has an art blog that comes out periodically. Great way to get information out there. Knows a lot of people that would be interested.
- Regions thought about sending in a "selected artists" to highlight on the webpage.
- Pieces that are viewed on the internet would be more meaningful if "artist statement" is available.
- West Regional Coordinator printed portions of the SLMM premise on cards to hand out. (this announcement brought a round of applause!)
- Frequent regional meeting to get to know all members better. Branch off, work crowd.
- Regional events could be open to all members.
- People have ideas but are not willing to volunteer or participate. Need for more volunteers.
- Need help with newspaper articles.
- Need volunteers to teach a class.
- Education is goal of group.
- Improve advertising for SLMM, improve social media contact, create a Facebook page/blog, and find someone with experience writing newspaper articles, magazines. Need more workers at conference.
- Share events, make postcards to pass out, talk to friends, and search out new members.
- Need better understanding of Facebook.
- Get a list of all art magazines that have free calendar listings and submit information on all regional events each
 month. These magazines are distributed all over the US and most of them sort events by states. Check out local
 newspapers that offer free calendar listings.

The art tasks help their brains improve function as my clients practice problem solving, decision making, visual attention, cognitive focus,

fine motor control, and verbal communication.
