

In Memoriam



Hanne-Lore Nepote passed away on September 25th, a few weeks before her 90th birthday.

"Hanne-Lore Sutro came to the States from her native Switzerland in 1939. Her father, a doctor, settled his family in the Bay Area where his relatives had already left their mark with the Sutro swimming complex beside the Cliff House. Hanne-Lore was a talented girl who soon entered the Oakland College of Arts and Crafts where one of her teachers was Alexander Nepote. At that time, she was exhibiting her paintings and was devoted to developing her skills, but soon they were married, and had two children, Paul and Linda, as Alex's career was beginning to climb. She turned to her family, serving Alex

as his frequent driver – she was an excellent driver – on their excursions into the mountains to take photographs for him while he sketched. Her energies were devoted to her children, running a fine kitchen, using her talents on behalf of her church, and Alex. Our friendship began when she came to Albuquerque for the two early meetings of the brand new Society of Layerists in Multi-Media before we had our inaugural exhibition at The Albuquerque Museum. Alex served briefly as president before his untimely death from cancer in 1986. Soon, Hanne-Lore began attending meetings with me and also with Marilyn Christenson. Hanne-Lore's painted collaged pieces with messages were in our books and shows. On one visit, I saw her finely crafted banners in the New Vision United Methodist Church of Millbrae. Over time, our friendship deepened and expanded. Many members have close memories of times shared with her. She and Linda went on our tours to England and Spain. A favorite adventure we had together in 1991 began when Ed and I stayed with her and then we all drove south to see Christo's installation of large yellow umbrellas planted on both sides of the highway in Tejon Pass leading to Los Angeles. We dropped her off for the return flight to Millbrae before driving home to New Mexico. In between visits, we shared phone calls, notes, letters and cards for years. She will be sorely missed." – Mary Carroll Nelson




